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**Kent Core**

Students must complete a minimum 36 credit hours of the Kent Core. Colleges or degree programs may specify certain courses to fulfill the requirements. Courses in the students' major field may count toward the completion of any Kent Core category. Honors equivalents shall satisfy the Kent Core. **Diversity Course Requirement**

Students must complete a two-course diversity requirement, consisting of one with a domestic focus and one with a global focus. One course must be come from the Kent Core. The second course may be taken as a second Kent Core; or within a major or minor; or as a general elective; or, with dean's approval, by completing one semester of study in another country. **Writing-Intensive Course Requirement**

**Upper-Division Requirement**

In general, baccalaureate programs require the successful completion of at least 39 upper-division (numbered 30000 to 49999) credit hours of coursework. Programs in the College of Arts and Sciences require a minimum of 42 hours of upper-division coursework.
