Special Notes for Program:

- Students double majoring in Audio Recording and Music Production can take the Audio Recording and Music Production III, IV, V and VI classes concurrently.
- The first 4 credit hours of ensemble apply as lower-division hours; the remaining hours of ensemble apply as upper-division hours
- Students are required to attend a minimum four-year total of 84 concerts or recitals.
- Applied music courses are available in the summer on selected instruments. Composition may also be taken in the summer

Note 1: Applied Studio Musicianship and Applied Music (6 semesters and 12 credit hours):

Applied music must be elected for the first 4 credit hours at 2 credits per semester. Students who meet performance requirements after the first 4 credit hours of applied music may complete the remaining 8 credit hours by taking applied studio musicianship to meet graduation requirements. Students must meet the 46000-entry-level requirement for graduation.

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Note 2: Major ensemble (8 semesters and 8 credit hours):

All music technology majors must enroll in an ensemble appropriate to their major performance area each semester the students are registered full time as music majors. The first 2 credit hours must be taken in a major ensemble. Students may choose to complete 6 hours in MUS 35213 Studio Ensemble, or 4 hours in MUS 35213 and 2 hours as ensemble electives (e.g., MUS 45231, MUS 25311 for guitar majors). The first 4 credit hours of ensemble apply as lower-division hours; the remaining hours apply as upper-division hours.

Note 3: Piano Class or Applied Music Piano (2 credit hours): placement test required.

Liberal Education Requirements (LER)

Students must complete a minimum 36 credit hours of Liberal Education Requirements. Colleges or degree programs may specify certain courses to fulfill the requirements. Courses in the students' major field will not count toward the completion of any LER. Honors equivalents shall satisfy the LER. Diversity Course Requirement

Students must complete a two-course diversity requirement, consisting of one with a domestic focus and one with a global focus. One course must be come from the LER and cannot be in the student's major. The second course may be taken as a second LER; or within a major or minor; or as a general elective; or, with dean's approval, by completing one semester of study in another country. Writing-Intensive Course Requirement
