Diversity Course Requirement
    Students must complete a two-course diversity requirement, consisting of one with a domestic (U.S.) focus and one with a global focus. One course must come from the Kent Core. The second course may be taken as a second Kent Core, within a major or minor, or as a general elective; or, with dean's approval, by completing one semester of study in another country.     Writing-Intensive Course Requirement
    Students must complete a one-course writing-intensive requirement in their major and earn minimum $C(2.000)$ grade.
