They are still required to take BSCI 11010 Foundational Anatomy and Physiology I. Students who have successfully completed ATTR/EXSC 25057/25058 Human Anatomy and Physiology I/II may use those courses in place of BSCI 11010/11020 Foundational Anatomy and Physiology I/II.
- Ashtabula students may take this course in Semester One.
- US 10097 is not required of transfer students with 25 credits (excluding College Credit Plus and dual-enrollment) or students age 21+ at time of admission.
- Permission of the director required for registration.
- Ashtabula students may take this course in the summer between Semester One and Semester Two.
- East Liverpool students complete this requirement in the summer between Semester Two and Semester Three.
- Ashtabula students complete this requirement in the summer between Semester Three and Semester Four.
