- 1. US 10097 is not required of transfer students with 25 credits (excluding College Credit Plus and dual-enrollment credit) or students age 21+ at time of admission.
- 2. Minimum 18 upper-division credit hours. Students may elect an established minor or a block of approved courses chosen in consultation with an advisor in lieu of an established minor. Student not choosing a minor must have all their coursework approved in writing by the School of Art and the College of the Arts. Number of credits required depends on meeting minimum 123 credit hours and minimum 39 upper-division credit hours
- 3. For art electives, minimum 6 credit hours must be in fine arts (ARTF), crafts (ARTC), Kent blossom art (KBA) or related studio area. The remaining credit hours may be in art history (ARTH).
- 4. A minimum C (2.000) grade must be earned to fulfill the writing-intensive requirement.
