They are still required to take BSCI 11010 Foundational Anatomy and Physiology I. Students who have successfully completed ATTR/EXSC 25057/25058 Human Anatomy and Physiology I/II may use those courses in place of BSCI 11010/11020 Foundational Anatomy and Physiology I/II.
- US 10097 is not required of transfer students with 25 credits (excluding College Credit Plus and dual-enrollment) or students age 21+ at time of admission.
- The Ashtabula campus offers this course in semester 4.
- Enrollment in this course is limited to students accepted to technical study which is a selective process, student who have met the following criteria will

be considered for acceptance: admission to the university; and, any prescribed developmental coursework; a minimum of 40 volunteer hours in at least two different occupational therapy settings; high school or college courses in algebra and general biology; and a 2.70 GPA.

Note: Clinical education must be successfully completed within 18 months of the didactic coursework.
