1. ASL 19201 Elementary American Sign Language I, ASL 19202 Elementary American Sign Language II, ASL 29201 Intermediate Sign Language I and ASL 29202 Intermediate American Sign Language II are prerequisites for the American Sign Language major. Students majoring in American Sign Language may have some proficiency in the language through high-school study or other experience. Students with previous American Sign Language study should take the American Sign Language Placement Test, offered twice per semester, and enroll in the correct course based on their score. In semesters one and two, students should students who demonstrate ASL proficiency beyond ASL 29201 and/or ASL 29202 should take general electives. Number of general elective credit hours required depends on meeting minimum 120 credit hours and minimum 42 upper-division hours.

2. UC 10097 is not required of transfer students with 25 credits (excluding College Credit Plus) or students age 21+ at time of admission.

3. Students must present a cumulative portfolio and achieve a passing score in ASL 29202 Intermediate American Sign Language II in order to register for ASL 39201 and ASL 49108.

  - One additional course taken from the Kent Core Basic Science courses in the following Arts and Sciences disciplines: Anthropology (ANTH), Biological Sciences (BSCI), Chemistry (CHEM), Geography (GEOG), Geology (GEOL) or Physics (PHY). Students may take the courses listed in the "introductory" sequences with the restrictions noted above in the Kent Core Basic Science section. The course may not be from the student's major.
  - One additional course taken from the Kent Core Social Sciences courses in the following Arts and Sciences disciplines: Anthropology (ANTH), Applied Conflict Management (CACM), Geography (GEOG), Criminology Justice Studies (CRIM), Political Science (POL), Psychology (PSYC) or Sociology (SOC). The course may not be from the student's major.
5. Number of general elective credit hours required depends on meeting minimum 120 credit hours and minimum 42 upper-division credit hours.
6. A minimum C grade must be earned in ANTH 48214, ASL 39223 or ASL 49309 to fulfill writing-intensive requirement.

8. Prior to enrolling in these courses, students must pass the Sign Language Proficiency Interview (SLPI) with a minimum score of Intermediate.

**Special Department Note**

Some courses in the Department of Modern and Classical Languages are offered on a rotating basis. Rotations and course availability may change at any time. Please see the Department's [course offering projections](#) and [advising information](#) for assistance with course planning.

**Foreign Language Note:** Students pursuing a Bachelor of Arts degree in the College of Arts and Sciences must have the equivalent of Elementary I and II in any language, and the American Sign Language major requires Intermediate I and II of the same language.

All students with prior foreign language experience should take the foreign language placement test to determine the appropriate level at which to start. Some students may begin their university foreign language experience beyond the Elementary I level and will complete the requirement with fewer credit hours and fewer courses. This may be accomplished by: (1) passing a course beyond Elementary I through Intermediate II level or (2) receiving credit through Credit by Exam (CBE), the College Level Examination Program (CLEP), the Advanced Placement (AP) exam or credit through the International Baccalaureate (IB) program; or (3) being designated a "native speaker" of a non-English language (consult with the College of Arts and Sciences Advising Office for additional information). When students complete the requirement with fewer than 14 credit hours and four courses, they will complete remaining hours with general electives.
