- Enrollment in this course is limited to students accepted to technical study which is a selective process, student who have met the following criteria will be considered for acceptance: admission to the university; completion of any prescribed developmental coursework; a minimum of 40 volunteer hours in at least two different occupational therapy settings; high school or college courses in algebra and general biology; and a minimum 2.70 GPA.

Note: Clinical education must be successfully completed within 18 months of the didactic coursework.
